*a note from Session*

Jesus said, "whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me." (Matthew 18:5, NIV) That's how important children are to Jesus.

Over the years, we've been able to welcome little children in our nursery. Now we're looking for someone who can pick up the torch and continue this ministry. Please take a moment and pray about who Jesus is calling to this place of service... and maybe it's you.

What would you need to do this? The necessary gifts include a love for storytelling and creative play activities. You'd need to have a passion or a strong desire to see little children welcomed in the church. Your working style would need to be flexible enough to deal with weeks when we have a couple of kids, and weeks when we have none. If this "GPS" lines up for you, then Jesus may be calling you to this service.

Or maybe you have a gift of administration and organizing comes relatively easy for you. That may be Christ's call, because someone who could co-ordinate several nursery workers would be really helpful as well.

What's involved in the nursery? Our nursery curriculum is designed with easy to tell stories and games and play activities for two- and three-year-olds. Each lesson is self-contained, so it would be easy to share the nursery work among several people, each taking a couple of weeks.

It can be a satisfying place to serve. Perhaps the best reward is knowing you have helped a child from the very beginnings of life to learn to enjoy the stories of the Bible.
