Compare how the story of Jonah ends with that of Job, “My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you, therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes”.

The epilogue of Job is in contrast to the final picture of Jonah sitting alone in the sun. He did not even “get it” after the episode with the vine.

How many times do we have to experience the “vine episode” before we “get it”?

Fortunately Adelaide Pollard “got it” early enough to have left us the legacy of this beautiful hymn. May its theme become the anchor of your faith.
