Surprisingly, this was submitted to me via a friend that admits that he is an atheist, but is always curious about our Christian way of life.

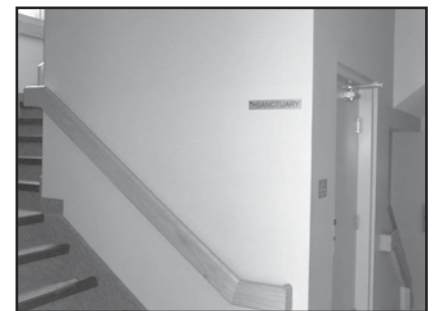
